When KC moved east to be a part of Canoe Kayak Canada, it then became [Head Coach] Rob Smith's turn to work Lindsay in his style, and get some great performances he knew she was capable of. New personal bests were starting to happen, and halfway through the season, he got her to ditch the stabilizers right before a regatta. She was a bit nervous, but also "stoked" for the challenge!

I convinced her to accompany me to the Nationals in Shawinigan, Que, and CanMas, seeing as she was old enough to race in CanMas. That was last year - she did amazing! Fittingly she was named the Paracanoe Athlete of the Year! I was so happy for her!

This year saw a change in Coaching with having Evan Landry at the helm for us in Canoe Kayak. He worked really well with Lindsay this year, along with Aiden Davis, they made sure Lindsay had the continued support with morning practises. Because of what parameters Paracanoe has with the sport, medical documentation must be submitted to the Classification Committee prior to attending a Canadian Nationals.

Why share this? Because of Lindsay's little known hidden superpower - Lawyer! I swear she has something about being able to engage in discussions most would fear to be a part of. Not our Lindsay. I am going to say this comes from the many years as a member of the Brock Niagara Penguins, and has been involved with the dealings in other Para sports, such as Wheelchair Basketball (that she is really good at by the way).

She also has the ability to advance the conversation (if the other party is willing) to try and make it better not only for her, but all of those who might follow in her footsteps.

Oh, just one more thing - she is an avid motorcyclist! She owns a Spyder, Ryker model - which is a gorgeous 3 wheeled motorcycle that she rides to work, rides to the club, goes on jaunts with her father, who has a cruiser, a Harley if I recall correctly.
