

Paddlers—Club members born in eight different decades—all enjoying the challenge and the benefits of our great Canadian sport in the season of Thanksgiving.

Today, October 1, I am proud to take on the role of SNCC Commodore at a time when our Club can count many assets just as it faces several challenges. On October 19 we expect an excellent turnout for our Awards Night and 15th Anniversary Celebration. 

GWN Challenge

Marking the end of the season for many, this marquee event by Great White North gives crews the chance to go out with a bang, celebrating with two days of racing in downtown Toronto. Running for over 25 years, this classic festival features teams coming from all over Canada and the US.

The Tim Hortons GWN Dragon Boat Challenge presented by BMO is held on the Western Beaches Watercourse in downtown Toronto's Marilyn Bell Park.

In 2023, SNCC entered a Women's team at GWN. The ladies made it to the Women's Division Grand A Finals where they managed their best 500m time of the weekend,

finishing with 2:40.50 just shy of a bronze medal. Also in the Women's Division Grand A Final 200m, the SNCC Canal Dragons finished fourth. Well done team!

There was also a 2000m race for the top 8 teams and a 100m sprint challenge for the top 4 teams in each division (Mixed, Women's, Breast Cancer Paddler). Canal Dragons finished in the C Division Championship in a very tight finish! A 2:38.52 for first place, Gene's Restaurant Juniors, a 2:38.55 for Canal Dragons, a 2:38.65 for Lambton Shores Super Oars, and a 2:39.09 for RowBust Dragon Boat Team for BCS. What an exciting way to end the day!
