Alwyn Morris

Alwyn Morris is a true Aboriginal hero and role model to Native kids all across Canada. He is the Winner of both a bronze and a gold medal in kayaking after representing Canada in the 1984 Summer Olympics. He was born and raised in Kahnawake, located on Mohawk Tribe territory, south of Montreal, Quebec. As he received his medal, Alwyn held up the feather of the same eagle that watched over him throughout his training. This gesture brought respect to his Mohawk Tribe, culture, and family.
